CLARIFYING THE ROLES BETWEEN
COUNTY AND CITY GOVERNMENTS

County

Parks and Recreation is responsible for 11 park properties across the county that encompass more than 300 acres of land. These properties vary in offerings from sports complexes to rentable community centers, a community and outdoor event space in downtown Clarksville, and passive recreation parks.

Parks and Recreation focuses its efforts on baseball and softball fields, lacrosse fields, hiking, nature access and programming, affordable spaces to rent for private events, and reaching underserved areas of the county with local park access.

Their goal is to develop and maintain quality parks and facilities; preserve open space and natural areas; protect environmental resources; promote healthy lifestyles; and provide recreational opportunities for visitors and residents.

City

Clarksville Parks & Recreation maintains 1,400 acres of parks and facilities in 21 parks. They provide a variety of indoor and outdoor programs, facilities, nature activities and entertainment events for people living in the Clarksville, Montgomery County and Fort Campbell area. Parks and Recreation offers a variety of amenities including playgrounds, picnic areas, walking trails, and pavilions.

Several of the parks throughout Clarksville also feature restrooms, open play areas, outdoor fitness equipment, splash pads, basketball and tennis courts, and sport fields.

They believe free or reasonably priced, year-round experiences help residents enhance their health, wellness and social engagement—resulting in a stronger, better community. Additionally, Clarksville Parks & Recreation maintains four public swimming pools and three recreation centers with year-round programming for youth, adults, and seniors.
