Proclamation 3537—Peace Officers Memorial Day and Police Week

May 4, 1963

By the President of the United States of America

A Proclamation

Whereas, from the beginning of this Nation, law enforcement officers have played an important role in safeguarding the rights and freedoms which are guaranteed by the Constitution and in protecting the lives and property of our citizens; and

Whereas, through constant application of new procedures and techniques, such officers are becoming more efficient in their enforcement of our laws; and

Whereas it is important that our people know and understand the problems, duties, and responsibilities of their police departments and the necessity for cooperating with them in maintaining law and order; and

Whereas it is fitting and proper that we express our gratitude for the dedicated service and courageous deeds of law enforcement officers and for the contributions they have made to the security and well-being of all our people; and

Whereas, by a joint resolution approved October 1, 1962 (76 Stat. 676), the Congress has requested the President to designate May 15 of each year as Peace Officers Memorial Day and the calendar week during which such May 15 occurs as Police Week:

Now, Therefore, I, John F. Kennedy, President of the United States of America, do hereby designate May 15, 1963, and May 15 of each succeeding year, as Peace Officers Memorial Day, in honor of those peace officers who, through their courageous deeds, have lost their lives or have become disabled in the performance of duty.

I also designate the week of May 12 through May 18, 1963, and the calendar week during which May 15 occurs of each succeeding year, as Police Week, in recognition of the service given by the men and women who, night and day, protect us through enforcement of our laws.

I invite State and local governments, patriotic, civic, and educational organizations, and the people of the United States generally, to observe Peace Officers Memorial Day and Police Week in this year and each succeeding year with appropriate ceremonies in which all our people may join in commemorating law enforcement officers, past and present, who by their faithful and loyal devotion to their responsibilities have rendered a dedicated service to their communities, and, in so doing, have established for themselves an enviable and enduring reputation for preserving the rights and security of all citizens.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the United States of America to be affixed.

DONE at the City of Washington this fourth day of May in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and sixty-three, and of the Independence of the United States of America the one hundred and eighty-seventh.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A LOAN PURSUANT TO A LOAN AGREEMENT BETWEEN MONTGOMERY COUNTY, TENNESSEE, AND THE PUBLIC BUILDING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF CLARKSVILLE, TENNESSEE, IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF NOT TO EXCEED \$4,565,900; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF SUCH LOAN AGREEMENT AND OTHER DOCUMENTS RELATING TO SAID LOAN; APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF A BOND BY SUCH PUBLIC BUILDING AUTHORITY; PROVIDING FOR THE APPLICATION OF THE PROCEEDS OF SAID LOAN AND THE PAYMENT OF SUCH INDEBTEDNESS; CONSENTING TO THE ASSIGNMENT OF THE COUNTY'S OBLIGATION UNDER SUCH LOAN AGREEMENT; AND, CERTAIN OTHER MATTERS

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners (the "Board"), of Montgomery County, Tennessee (the "County"), has determined that it is necessary to finance the costs of certain "public works projects", as defined in Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated, as from time to time amended and supplemented, consisting of financing all or a portion of the costs of repairs and improvements at the landfill operated and maintained by the Bi County Solid Waste Management System, a component unit of the County, including but not limited to, State mandated compliance work associated with cap and close requirements within the Class I permit and Class III permit, as well as construction of Phase II of the recent Class I expansion, including labor, equipment, materials, and sub-contracting expenses associated with such closure and construction, the acquisition of all property real and personal appurtenant thereto and connected with such work, and to pay all legal, fiscal, administrative, and engineering costs incident thereto, reimbursement for expenditures related to the foregoing projects and to pay costs incident to the issuance of the Bond and the loan of the proceeds thereof to the County (collectively, the "Project"), by obtaining a loan from The Public Building Authority of the City of Clarksville, Tennessee (the "Authority"); and

WHEREAS, the Bi County Solid Waste Management System (the "System"), was established by an interlocal agreement between Montgomery County, Stewart County, and the City of Clarksville, for the joint and cooperative operation and maintenance of a solid waste collection disposal system; and

WHEREAS, the System is a component unit of the County; and

WHEREAS, the System is operated by a Board of Directors (the "Board of Directors"), whose members are appointed by the joint participants; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the System has requested that the County incur the indebtedness for the purpose of financing the Project for the System; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Board of Directors of the System and the Board of the County to be in the best interests of the County to finance the Project through The Tennessee Municipal Bond Fund fixed rate loan program; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has been established pursuant to the provisions of Title 12, Chapter 10, Tennessee Code Annotated, as amended (the "Act"), and is authorized pursuant to the provisions of the Act to issue its bonds from time to time, in one or more series, and to loan the proceeds thereof to the County for the above described purposes; and

WHEREAS, in order to effectuate the program, the Issuer has authorized and approved by its Resolution, adopted March 12, 2018, the issuance of its Local Government Loan Program Bonds, in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$300,000,000; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will issue its Local Government Loan Program Bond, Series 2018 (Bi County Solid Waste Management System Loan) (the "Bond"), in the principal amount of not to exceed Four Million Five Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars (\$4,565,900), and loan the proceeds thereof to the County pursuant to the provisions of a Loan Agreement, by and among the County, the Authority, and the Purchaser, as hereinafter defined, to be dated the date of issuance and delivery (the "Loan Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of the County has on the date hereof adopted an Initial Resolution authorizing the borrowing of funds and the incurring of indebtedness for the purpose of financing the Project in the amount of not to exceed \$4,565,900, and the County Clerk has been instructed to publish such Initial Resolution together with the Notice required by Section 9-21-206 of Tennessee Code Annotated, as amended, in a local newspaper in the County; and

WHEREAS, the indebtedness evidenced by the Loan Agreement shall be payable from any and all funds of the County legally available therefor, including, but not necessarily limited to, ad valorem taxes to be levied for such purpose on all taxable property within the corporate limits of the County, without limitation as to time, rate, and amount and for the punctual payment of said principal of, premium, if any, and interest on, the Loan Agreement, the full faith and credit of the County will be irrevocably pledged; provided, however, it is the intention of the County and the System that the indebtedness evidenced by the Loan Agreement shall be paid from funds of the System; and

WHEREAS, the Bond is to be secured by and contain such terms and provisions as set forth in a Bond Purchase Agreement, entered into between the Authority and the purchaser of the Bond (the "Purchaser").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Montgomery County, Tennessee, as follows:

- Section 1. Approval of the Loan. (a) For the purpose of providing funds to finance the Project and to pay costs incident to the issuance and sale of the Bond and the loan of the proceeds thereof to the County, the loan to the County from the Authority is hereby authorized in the principal amount of not to exceed \$4,565,900 and the County is hereby authorized to borrow such funds from the Authority (the "Loan").
- (b) The Bond to be issued by the Authority shall bear interest at a fixed rate to be determined at the time of the issuance of the Bond, as provided in the Loan Agreement. The County Mayor and County Clerk are authorized to enter into the Loan Agreement, such Loan Agreement to bear interest at a fixed rate, as the County Mayor and the Executive Director of the System shall determine is in the best interest of the County and the System. The County and/or the System shall make payments of interest and principal in the amounts and on the dates set forth in the Loan Agreement from the sources and funds described herein and in the Loan Agreement. The final rate of interest payable on the Loan Agreement shall not exceed the maximum rate of interest permitted by applicable law. The Loan Agreement shall be for a term of ten years. The final principal and interest payment dates, final interest rate payable, amortization of principal amounts of the loan evidenced by the Loan Agreement, and prepayment provisions of such Loan Agreement, may be established by the County Mayor and the Executive Director of the System, at the time of the sale of the Bond and the execution and delivery of the Loan Agreement, as shall be determined to be in the best interests of the County and the System, in accordance with the terms of this Resolution and the Loan Agreement.
- Section 2. Approval of Loan Agreement. The form, terms, and provisions of the Loan Agreement are in the best interest of the County and are hereby approved and the Board hereby authorizes the County Mayor and the County Clerk of the County to execute and deliver such Loan Agreement, such Loan Agreement to be in substantially the form of the Loan Agreement presented to this meeting, the

execution of such Loan Agreement by the County Mayor and the County Clerk to evidence their approval of any and all changes to such Loan Agreement, and any related documents necessary to the consummation of the transactions contemplated by the Loan Agreement. The County further agrees to comply with, and to enable the Authority to comply with, all covenants and requirements contained in the Bond Purchase Agreement and that certain Tax Exemption Certificate to be executed by the Authority at the time of the issuance of the Bond.

Section 3. Fulfillment of Obligations. The Board of the County is authorized and directed to fulfill all obligations of the County under the terms of the Loan Agreement.

Section 4. Tax Levy. There shall be levied and collected in the same manner as other ad valorem taxes of the County on all taxable property within the corporate limits of the County without limitation as to time, rate, or amount, to the extent necessary in the event funds of the County legally available to pay the indebtedness evidenced by the Loan Agreement are insufficient, a tax sufficient to pay when due the amounts payable under the Loan Agreement, as and when they become due, and to pay any expenses of maintaining and operating the Project required to be paid by the County under the terms and provisions of the Loan Agreement. For the prompt payment of the Loan Agreement, both principal and interest, as the same shall become due, the full faith and credit of the County are irrevocably pledged.

It is the intention of the County and the System that the indebtedness evidenced by the Loan Agreement shall be payable from funds of the System, subject to the payment of reasonable and necessary costs of operating, maintaining, repairing, and insuring such System, and to any pledge of such revenues in favor of other obligations of the System.

Section 5. Approval of Bond and Bond Purchase Agreement. For the purpose of providing funds to make the loan to the County evidenced by the Loan Agreement, as provided herein and in the Loan Agreement, and to pay legal, fiscal, and administrative costs incident thereto, including costs incident to the issuance and sale of the Bond related to the Loan Agreement, the issuance and sale of the Bond by the Authority in connection with the Loan Agreement is hereby approved. The County further approves the execution and delivery of the Bond Purchase Agreement by the Authority in connection with the issuance of the Bond.

Section 6. Disposition of Proceeds. The proceeds from the sale of the Bond shall be paid, from time to time, to the official designated by the System as the custodian of the funds, upon submission of a requisition for such funds by the System to the Purchaser in accordance with the terms of the Loan Agreement. Such proceeds shall be disbursed solely to finance the costs of the Project and to pay costs of issuance incurred in connection with the issuance of the Bond and the loan of the proceeds thereof to the County. Any monies remaining in the Project Fund after completion of the Project shall be used to pay debt service on the Bond.

Section 7. Consent to Assignment. The County hereby consents to the assignment of all of the Authority's right, title, and interest in and to the Loan Agreement as security for the Bond to which such Loan Agreement relates, except for certain reserved rights of the Authority, to the Purchaser.

Section 8. Reimbursement Provisions. The County may have made or may hereafter make expenditures with respect to the Project from a source of funds other than proceeds of the loan from the Authority under the Loan Agreement, such expenditures occurring prior to the execution and delivery of the Loan Agreement. The County reasonably expects that it will reimburse such original expenditures with proceeds of the loan from the County made pursuant to the Loan Agreement to the extent permissible under Treasury Regulation 1.150-2.

Section 9. Arbitrage Certification. The County recognizes that the Purchaser of the Bond will have accepted it on, and paid therefor a price, that reflects the understanding that interest thereon is excludable from gross income for purposes of federal income taxation under laws in force on the date of delivery of the Bond. In this connection, the County agrees that it shall take no action which may cause the interest on the Bond to be included in gross income for federal income taxation. It is the reasonable expectation of the Board of the County that the proceeds of the Bond will not be used in a manner which will cause the Bond to be an "arbitrage bond" within the meaning of Section 148 of the Code, and to this end the proceeds of the Bond and other related funds established for the purposes herein set out shall be used and spent expeditiously for the purposes described herein. The Board further covenants and represents that in the event it shall be required by Section 148(f) of the Code to pay any investment proceeds of the Bond to the United States government, it will make such payments as and when required by said Section 148(f) and will take such other actions as shall be necessary or permitted to prevent the interest on the Bond from becoming taxable. The County Mayor and County Clerk, or either of them, are authorized and directed to make such certifications in this regard in connection with the sale of the Bond as either or both shall deem appropriate. and such certifications shall constitute a representation and certification of the County.

Section 10. Miscellaneous Acts. The County Mayor, the County Clerk, the County Trustee, the County Attorney, the officials of the System, and all other appropriate officials of the County are hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to do any and all such acts and things, and to execute, acknowledge, and deliver all such documents, instruments, and certifications, in connection with the execution of the Loan Agreement and the issuance of the Bond by the Authority, in addition to those acts, things, documents, instruments, and certifications hereinbefore authorized and approved, as may in their discretion, be necessary or desirable to implement or comply with the intent of this Resolution or any of the documents herein authorized and approved.

<u>Section 11</u>. <u>Captions</u>. The captions or headings in this Resolution are for convenience only and shall in no way define, limit, or describe the scope or intent of any provision hereof.

Section 12. Severability. Should any provision or provisions of this Resolution be declared invalid or unenforceable in any respect by final decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, ordinance, or provisions shall not affect the remaining provisions of such Resolution.

<u>Section 13.</u> <u>Repeal of Conflicting Resolutions.</u> All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

Section 14. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect upon its adoption, the welfare of the County requiring it.


